

"This goes hand in hand with what I value; emotions. Happiness, confidence, thoughtfulness, anything that creates a memory or lets people feel something when looking at the picture."

Is there someone or something that influences your work? How is that?

"Definitely yes! But it's difficult to narrow it down to one person or thing in specific. But right now, I would say it's the people that are around me every day. There are so many talented people that push creativity, join photoshoots and support ideas. Encouragement and trying new things, has influenced the quality of my work and my skillset so much over the past year."

Why did you start doing photography?

"I was always interested in capturing moments, when my dad bought a dslr 5 years ago. I was so interested that I started teaching myself about all the technical features and workings of a camera. Since then, this hobby has stuck with me and the learning process never stopped."

How would you describe your photography style?

"This is a very difficult question for me! In general, I would say the main focus for me is on people and I usually work with natural everyday light and surroundings. A specific style however is hard to define, especially since I have had so many new opportunities lately. with using professional photo studio and learning more about this side of photography."



How do you connect with clients (the people you take pictures of)?

"For me, the biggest thing is to always greet them with a smile and encourage them during the shoot. Make them feel comfortable and let them get used to the camera. If they usually don't model, taking the focus away from the camera and talking about a casual topic does wonders."



"The best advice I can give you regarding photography, or anything in that matter, is just to try it out."




"Am I going to be comfortable and what piece can I add to be chic? If I am comfortable and chic, I am happy and confident."

PHOTOGRAPHER'S NOTE

SONY ALPHA 7 R II

The Sony A7 R II got introduced in 2015. This mirrorless camera is the first to introduce the 5-axis image stabilization. The camera has a hybrid autofocus system allowing the camera to make 5 pictures every second, this system is 30% faster than Sony's previous A7 model. In addition to that, the camera's ISO goes up to 25600 making it possible to deliver great quality images with low light. This fullframe camera uses a Bionz X processer which results into images with more detail and less noise. addition to this camera being great for photography, it also has great film options. The built-in image stabilization allows the camera to create smooth footage. The Sony A7 R II can shoot 4k with 24 frames per second and 1080 k with 60, 30 or 24 frames per second. Overall this camera has great features and it most fitted for people who have experience with photography.

ASKING JULE: ANY BACKGROUND STORY ABOUT THE CAMERA YOU ARE USING?

This was the first camera I bought myself and my first huge investment into doing photography a little more professional. This gives it a lot of personal value to me.

ANY ADVANTADGES? DISADVANTAGES?

Many photographers will probably laugh at this, but to me small and compact is one of the biggest selling points. I love to travel, and when I do, I for sure want to take my camera! The Sony alpha 7r II being mirrorless, makes it tiny in comparison to similarly powerful Dslr cameras.





However, the camera can only be as good as the lens you put on it - the body is only half the camera. Other than that, the focus and detail are amazing, the one thing that gets really annoying sometimes is that the screen can't be flipped, YOURITE CAMERA?

I've recently bought a Rollei b35. It's a tiny analog film analog film camera. completely new territory for me. But I love the manual control and the thought behind each rewind of film. It back the gives original process and the importance behind taking a picture. Right now, I would say this is my favorite camera because there is still so much that I haven't tried yet. Also, I've mainly used it for personal snaps and just remembering the feeling of a particular moment.

SECONDHAND SHOP DE PLEK

Interviewing Peter Owner of De Plek

Can you tell us about what De Plek is and how it started?

"De Plek is a vintage clothing store that I started together with my girlfriend, one and a half years ago. Before us, there was another lady, an older lady, who was doing vintage clothing a bit more in the fifty-sixty style-ish clothing which is more of a niche. After her rental contract expired the owner of the building asked if we wanted to make use of it. So, if we want to take all the stuff over and start our own company here. That's kind of how It started, we didn't have a plan or anything."

Was it a dream of you to start a business?

"Well, not really a dream. It was really spontaneous, I guess. And it just happened. I was still studying, but already at the end, so I was already thinking about what I should do after that, and then this opportunity came up. But before that, we were always into fashion. Just for ourselves, but we would always go to thrift shops and markets and buy a lot of clothing that we like. So it's always been a passion of ours."

Why a vintage store and not a general clothing store?

"That's also because we started with buying clothes for ourselves in thrift shops, because we didn't have a lot of money. I guess it started when I needed to pay for my own clothes and my parents didn't give me money anymore. I started with 50 euros. Normally you go into the city and buy one piece in a shop. But you can buy a lot of stuff at a thrift shop, it's really unique and you find clothes that nobody else has. So, I guess that's why I also like vintage because every piece is different than another piece of clothing. It is not that you buy one shirt and you walk in the city and you see more people in the same shirt."

Would you say your store has a specific kind of style?

"A lot of stuff that we have here is from the 80s or 90s. That's what we buy and what we like."

When is something considered vintage?

"I think it was somewhere around 20 years, so when it's 20 years or older, it gets vintage. But I'm not too sure anymore. Otherwise, it's called retro and retro looks vintage but it's new."









Would you say vintage is having a comeback and if so, why do you think that's happening?

"I think it's really an upcoming thing. You also see it here in the store: It's really busy. Why? I don't know. It's probably because people influence other people what they are wearing. It's also really weird because I started buying second-hand clothing when I was like 16 and it was always really quiet in thrift shops. I was most of the time the only one in the shop. I could have found a lot of cool stuff. And now it's really busy also in thrift shops. I think just more people are finding out that second-hand clothing and vintage clothing is more unique. It always had a stigma like it was a bit dirty or old but the whole idea just disappeared."


Talking about reusing old stuff: Do you think second-hand clothing is the solution to fast fashion and more sustainable fashion?

"Maybe a little bit, but not the solution. I think a solution would be more people just buying less stuff. It's a good thing that stuff gets used and doesn't get thrown away because it gets in like a sort of a cycle. But I hope that that also happens in clothing from now."

What is a new upcoming fashion trend you've noticed or that you're a fan of?

"An upcoming thing that you see is oversized stuff and really big sweaters. I also think that it is a trend to mix all these styles of the 90s, 80s and 2000. So it's not really one style anymore. A lot of people are buying brand clothes as well. For example old Ralph Lauren shirts or sweaters from Gucci."





What is your future goal or dream?

"Maybe we want to have a bigger shop someday because now we always have to make a selection of clothing since the store is just too small. I guess that's the bigger goal. I don't want to go too big because I'm just doing this together with my girlfriend and it's cool that it goes like this and I hope it goes steady and maybe upwards. But we just want to buy cool stuff and that's it."

Do you have tips for students when shopping on a budget?

"Oh, yeah, go to thrift shops! If I buy clothing for myself, I grab something when we're buying stuff for the store, but most of the time I also buy my clothing at thrift shops. This one (De Plek) is a bit more expensive, but this is because we need to live, we have to pay the rent and it's hard to find the good stuff."

So what is your personal clothing preference?

"Suits are a thing that I like. I buy a lot of suits. I think I have around 16 suits now. They're all really unique: So, for example, green suits or weird Italian suits. I just really like stuff that's different than the other stuff. I always try to find something that not a lot of people are wearing and I really like it. ut also a lot of woman's clothing."

AQUA ZOO LEEUWARDEN


