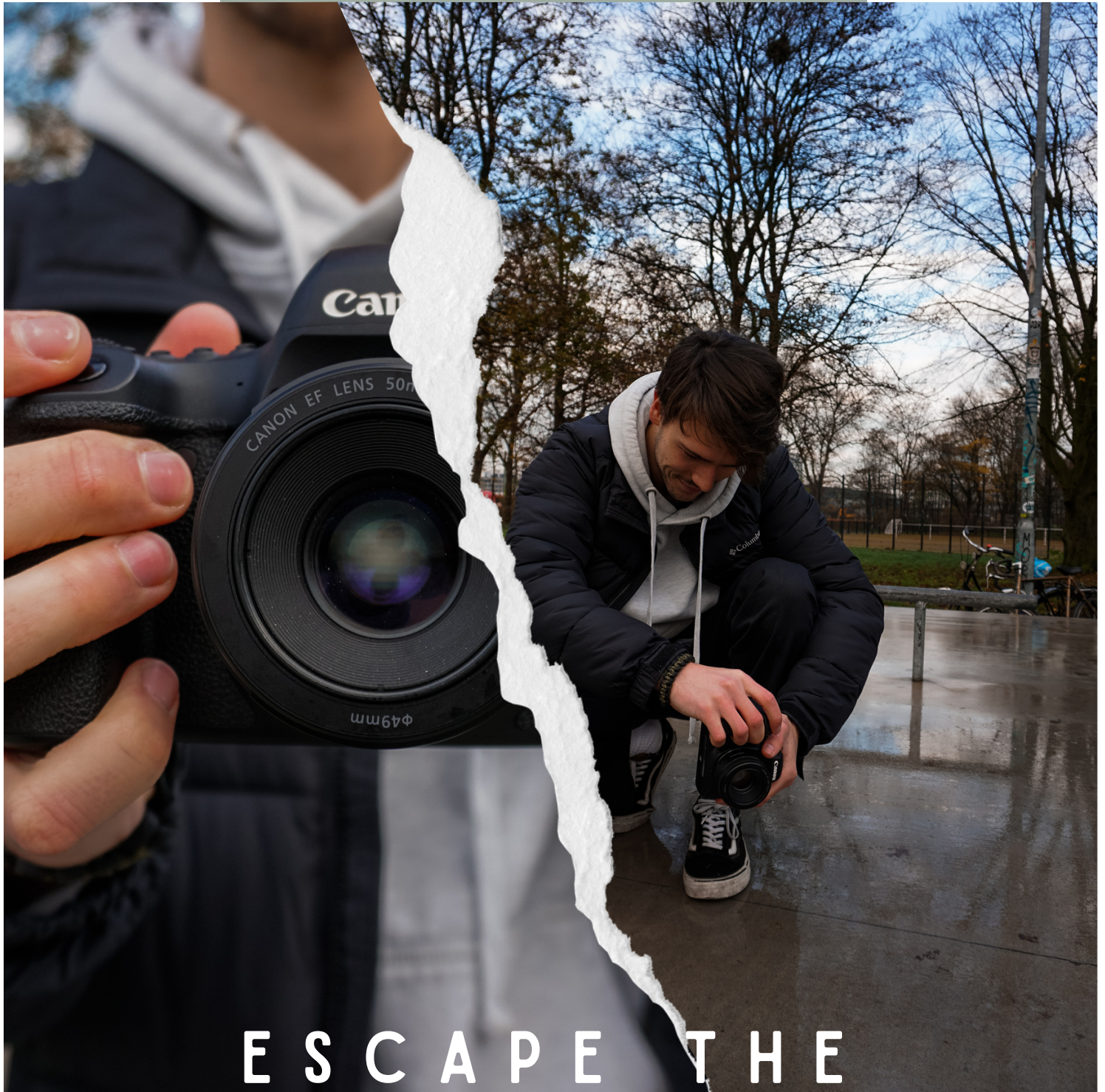


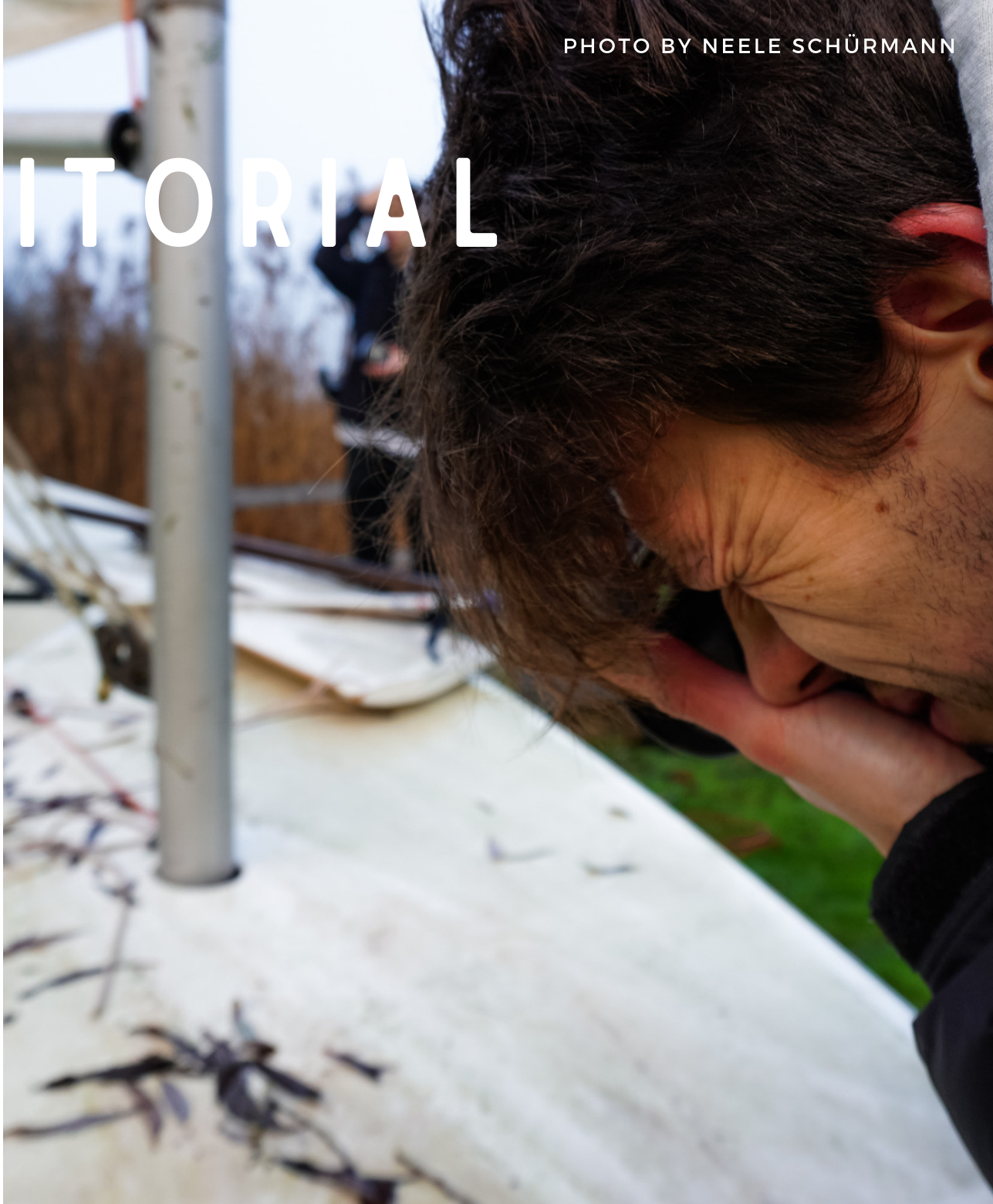

GOALS

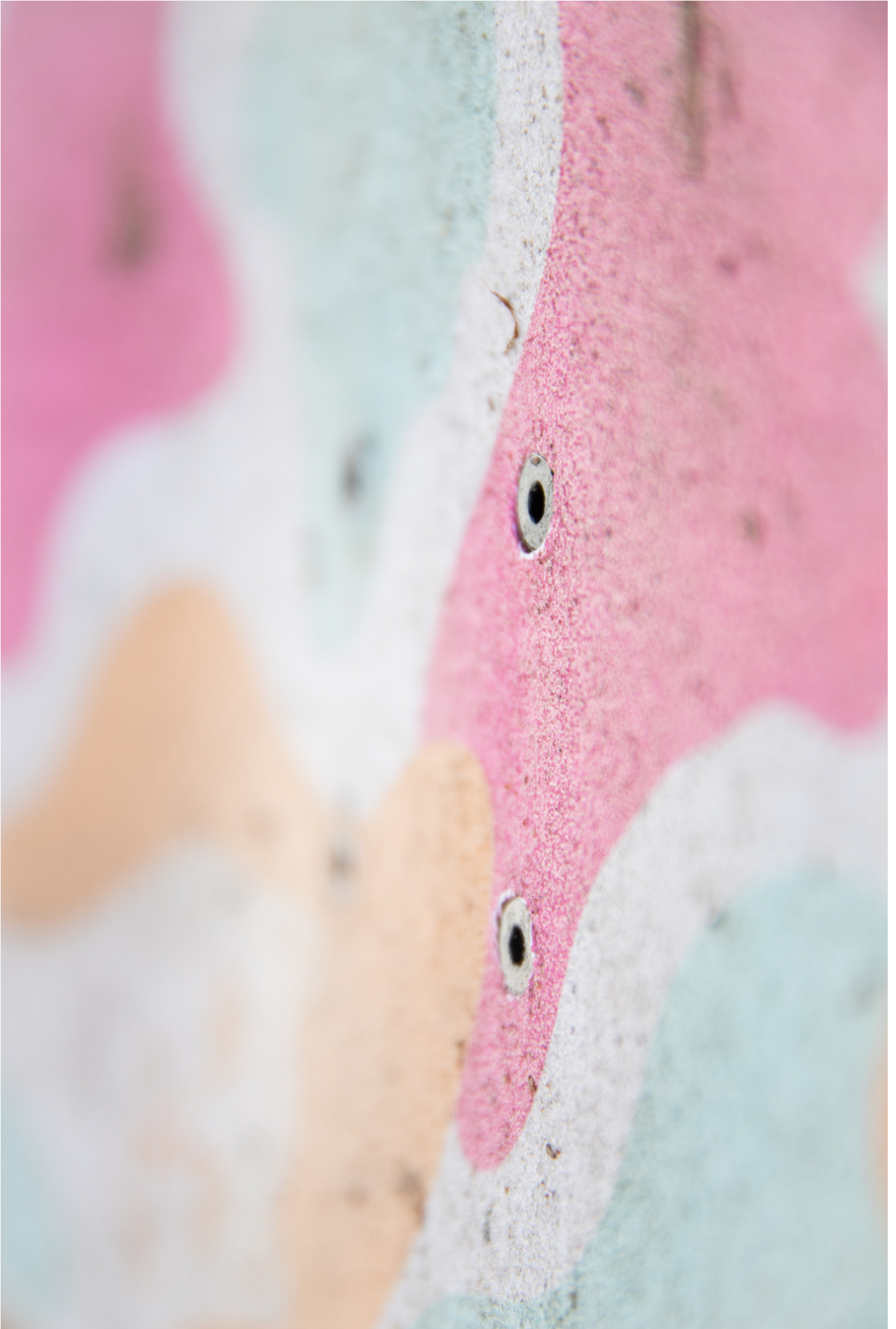
"I try to set myself a goal before every session. Then I practice that trick for most of the session and when I actually land it in the end, that's just the best feeling."

Canon EOS 6D Mark II is a full-frame digital single-lens reflex camera announced by Canon in 2017 as a 6D sequel in 5 years. 'The world's lightest full-frame DSLR' was its catchphrase when it was first released. And the camera has the advantage that even beginners could grasp at once. The enhanced AF, high sensitivity, low noise performance, light weight of 685g and low price are enough to stimulate the desire to purchase.

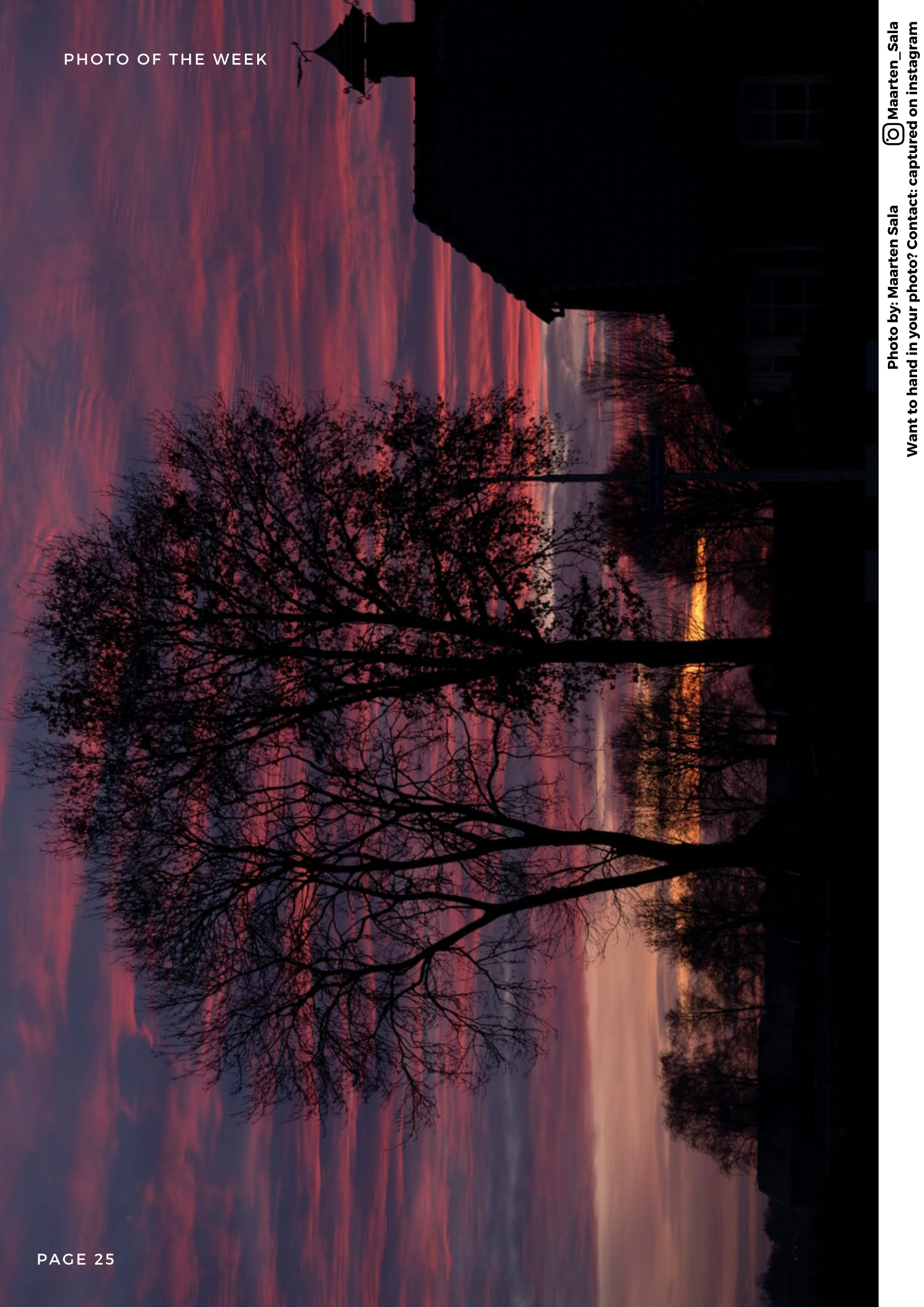
Advantage Very solid, high quality, easy to handle.

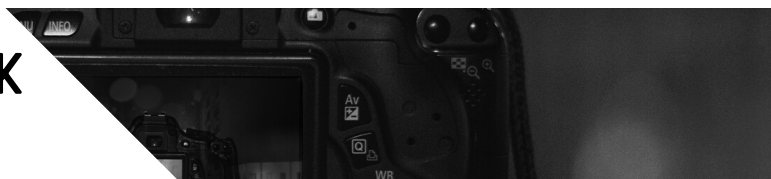
